MT. VIEW STUDENTS VISIT THE SCHOOLHOUSE

It has become a tradition for third grade students of nearby Mt. View Elementary school to celebrate the end of the school year with a visit to the Soap Creek Schoolhouse for "Pioneer Day" in June. Around 60 students arrive on a school bus and take part with teachers and volunteers in spelling bees, nature walks, and hands-on demonstrations in pioneer-style carpentry. The students are encouraged to dress in pioneer clothing and to bring pioneer-style lunches. Whether the weather is damp or dry, the kids think it's perfect for eating lunch outside and playing games in the tall grass.

This year, neighbor and volunteer Doug Pollock brought a very special project in addition to his antique woodworking tools: specially-milled, planed, and dovetailed "beams" cut from a neighbor's salvaged dead tree. The beams could be assembled onsite to build a miniature log cabin big enough for the kids to play in, and to imagine a life built with one's own hands. It was a huge success, as was the whole day.

In Doug's words, "Before this year's event, I was debating whether I should tell the teachers I'm all done volunteering. Then, one of the mothers came up and told me how her daughter had been there a couple of years ago. She said it was her daughter's favorite thing she ever did at school, how she still has her cedar shingle in her room, how much she enjoyed using the boring machine, etc. At that moment, I thought to myself, 'Great now I can never quit!'"



BIRDS AND BIRDHOUSES

The Audubon Society of Corvallis donated 10 new bluebird boxes to the Soap Creek neighborhood in 2017, to replace several old ones earlier built by neighbor Barry Glassman that had started disintegrating. The boxes are being monitored by Audubon volunteers, who report almost half and half swallows and bluebirds, with also a few wrens and a chickadee building nests.

How to tell the difference by looking at the nests? In general, tree swallows build with feathers, bluebirds with dry grasses, wrens with dry sticks sometimes filling the entire birdhouse, and chickadees with dry moss, which makes the absolutely softest nest.

In the course of the nesting season, though, bullying, villainy and even murder between species are rampant, resulting in mixed-looking nests, eggs removed and destroyed by competitors, and tragedies happening to parent birds. A successful "fledging" of young birds is truly something to celebrate!

SCHOOLHOUSE BUILDING RENTAL

The Soap Creek Schoolhouse is available for use throughout the year for small meetings of local interest. Please obtain permission and a key by contacting Nancy Hyde.

A \$20 key deposit is required. Rental fees: schools and community groups, no charge. Small private groups, \$20. Profit-making groups, \$20-100, to be negotiated in advance. Ongoing classes: \$5 per day. All groups must leave the premises tidy.

No running water is available. A permanent modern outhouse facility is on-site. Lights, electricity (2 outlets) and heat are available.

Please note: the Schoolhouse Foundation does not endorse any political or religious group but does allow its facilities to be used by such groups.
